## **Treasure Valley Partnership to Host First-Ever Regional Town Hall on Growth, Public Safety, and Infrastructure**

**NAMPA, ID** — With fire stations sitting empty, rising emergency response pressures, and infrastructure stretched beyond capacity, the greater Treasure Valley Partnership (TVP) is inviting residents to its first-ever Regional Town Hall on January 14 in Nampa.

For nearly 30 years, TVP has united the mayors and county commissioners from across Ada and Canyon counties (and beyond) to address the shared challenges of a rapidly growing region. This month, they're coming together to publicly discuss how growth is impacting everyday services — and how local leaders are working together to secure the updated and modern tools needed to keep communities safe, connected, and thriving.
