Local Leaders Invite Community to Discuss Shared Challenges at a Treasure Valley Partnership Regional Town Hall

EAGLE, ID — All across the Treasure Valley, continued growth is putting increasing pressure on the daily services communities rely on. Fire stations are sitting empty, emergency response times are falling, utility demands are rising, and local governments are being asked to do more with less.

On Wednesday, March 18, the greater Treasure Valley Partnership (TVP) will host its second Regional Town Hall, this time in Eagle, to bring residents into the conversation about how rapid growth and the lack of stronger funding tools are impacting Idahoans' public safety, infrastructure, and quality of life.

The central challenge facing the Treasure Valley is simple: growth is no longer paying for growth. While new neighborhoods and developments continue to expand, state limitations on local funding tools make it increasingly difficult for cities and counties to keep pace with rising demands for emergency services, infrastructure, and community amenities. This TVP Regional Town Hall will provide residents with an opportunity to hear directly from local leaders about these challenges and the collaborative solutions being explored to keep Treasure Valley communities safe, connected, and thriving.

The greater Treasure Valley Partnership is a longstanding coalition of mayors and county commissioners, representing three counties and 16 cities.
